

GDPR Privacy Notice

The Mid Cotswold Tracks and Trails Group is the 'Controller' of any personal data that you have provided to us. We have a record, derived from the submitted membership forms, which may include your name, address, email, phone number, and areas where you ride.

Why do we need your data?

We use this basic personal data to keep you updated of our activities, and may sometimes contact you about specific issues in your area. We will not collect any personal data from you that we do not need.

What do we do with your data?

The only people with access are members of the committee; in practice this is normally restricted to the Chair (Pat Harris), Membership Secretary (Sue Davis) and IT person (Steve Radcliffe). If details need to be passed between these people, we share via a password protected, cloud storage system (Microsoft One Drive). This is considered to be more secure than using email. We do not share personal data with the British Horse Society (to whom we are affiliated). No Third Parties have access to your personal data unless the law allows them to do so.

How long do we keep your data?

Unless you ask us to delete them, the data will be retained as long as the organisation continues to function. If it is wound up, the data will be deleted. We will ask you to confirm your permission before considering passing data to any possible successor organisation.

What are your rights?

We will delete all copies of your data promptly, if requested. You can ask for a copy of the information that we hold at any time, and any inaccuracies will be corrected promptly. Complaints can be raised with any member of the Committee, whose contact details are found on the website www.MidCotswoldTrails.org.uk, or via midcotsit@gmail.com. If you are not satisfied with our response, or believe we are processing your personal data other than in accordance with the law, you can complain to the Information Commissioner's Office <https://ico.org.uk/>
